We are pleased to announce that school lunch will now be available at no charge to all students enrolled at American Preparatory Academy, as well as siblings age 1-18 living in the student's household. Thanks to a temporary waiver released by the USDA on September 1, 2020, American Preparatory Academy is participating in the Seamless Summer Option, operating "open restricted" sites.

Participation will be restricted/limited for safety of students and capacity limitations. Meals are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. Meals will be provided through the end of 2020 or until available funds run out.

Lunches must be pre-ordered and picked up at the following locations during the scheduled days/times.

Draper 2 (serving Draper 1, 2, and 3 campuses)  
West Valley 2 (serving West Valley 1 and 2 campuses)  
Salem (serving Salem campus)

There is no guarantee to the length of this waiver. As such, we are encouraging parents to continue applying for free and reduced meal eligibility, so they do not experience a lapse in benefits upon termination of the waiver.
